Managing Shoreline Retreat in the United States: A Three ...

"Managed retreat" encompasses a range of more aggressive approaches, such as limiting replacement of structures destroyed by erosion or flooding, and relocating existing structures out of hazard zones. Some states have also implemented "buy-back" programs to purchase properties in high-risk coastal zones.

Managed or planned retreat (also known as managed realignment, resilient relocation and transformational adaptation) allows the shoreline to advance inward unimpeded. Managed retreat defined by Hino et al 2017as "the strategic relocation of structures or abandonment of land to manage natural hazard risk."

Surfer's Point Managed Shoreline Retreat Project The City of Ventura, California, has had ongoing erosion at Surfer's Point, a popular surfing spot, adjacent to the mouth of the Ventura River. A California State Park bike path along the shoreline and an adjacent County Fairground parking lot, have also experienced frequent damage from erosion.

Surfer's Point Managed Shoreline Retreat Project ...

A key campaign success and ongoing project for the Surfrider Foundation Ventura County Chapter is the Surfers' Point Managed Shoreline Retreat. Instead of building a seawall or other coastal armor, which would have destroyed the beach and surf break, stakeholders came together and approved a plan to move the parking lot, pedestrian path, and bike path away from the tideline.

The managed retreat ideal is distinguished from basic shoreline retreat in the following ways: (1) it is broader in its definition as a complete management strategy but uses some of the concepts of basic retreat; and (2) it differentiates the characteristics of the coastline while attempting to move development—where appropriate—out of impending threat.

In southwestern France, a shoreline road in the municipalities of Sète et de Marseillan (Languedoc-Roussillon region) was moved inland as it was threatened by erosion of the beach. This allowed the reconstruction of a larger beach and dune system, which together should provide greater protection against erosion. The work was completed in 2012.

Retreat from high-risk areas — Climate-ADAPT

Managed retreat or managed realignment is a coastal management strategy that allows the shoreline to move inland, instead of attempting to hold the line with structural engineering. At the same time, natural coastal habitat is enhanced seaward of a new line of defense.

The Surfers’ Point Managed Shoreline Retreat project is one of the first managed retreat projects to be implemented in California. By 2005, the group issued a report recommending a managed retreat plan for the Great Highway and several parking lots in order to accommodate restoration of the beach. Those planning efforts have come to fruition in this LCP amendment, a milestone that lays the groundwork for a more robust shoreline management plan in San Francisco.

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
